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QUESTION NO: 1

An organization uses an enterprise IP address management (IPAM) system as the authoritative source for address allocation and DNS records. Virtual machines deployed through VMware Cloud Foundation Automation must request addresses from that system rather than from static ranges maintained in the automation service.

Which configuration should the administrator implement?

- C. An image mapping associated with the project

ANSWER: A

Explanation:

An external IPAM integration connects VMware Cloud Foundation Automation to the enterprise IPAM provider so address allocation can be requested from the authoritative system. The integration is then used by the relevant network configuration and profile. A cloud zone selects compute placement, an image mapping selects a source image, and a flavor mapping selects compute sizing; none of these components provides external IP address allocation.

Explanation:

Match the components as follows:

Workflow → The primary automation unit; a sequence/schema of tasks and decisions that performs an automated process.

Action → A reusable function, typically JavaScript-based, that can be called from multiple workflows to avoid duplicated code.

Scriptable Task → A workflow element used to write and execute custom script logic directly in the workflow.

Configuration Element → Stores persistent, reusable configuration values/attributes, such as endpoints, constants, or timeout settings.

Resource Element → Stores or imports external resource files, including text, XML, and binary files, for workflow use.

Environment → Defines the runtime and dependencies/libraries required for polyglot scripting or external integrations.

Workflow Token → The execution record created for a particular workflow run; contains its state, inputs, outputs, and execution/audit details.
